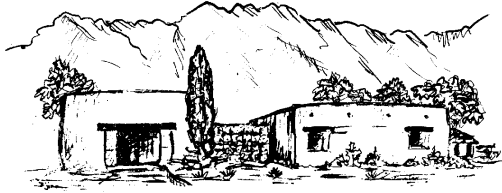

Fourth Sunday Collection

February 24: La Clinica Guadalupeana provides much needed health care services to residents of the colonias in far east El Paso County. It is located at 901 Ascencion Rd in the lower valley. The clinic, founded by Sister Janet Gildea, M.D., began operating from the trunk of a car in 1995. They have expanded in an effort to meet the needs of their community and now serve over 8,000 patients a year. Many of the services, materials, and equipments needed for the clinic are donated. At the present time, they need medical supplies (glucose test strips, insulin syringes, ACE bandages and gift cards for humidifiers and prescriptions), cleaning supplies, office supplies, and materials and labor to take care of the clinic facilities. Our 4th Sunday collection will help La Clinica provide services in an often-ignored part of our community.

On-going fund raisers

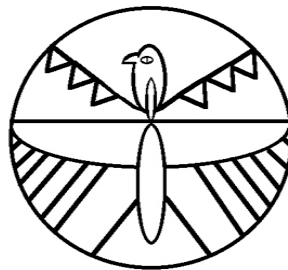
Our on-going fund raisers include the Albertsons
Community Partner card and E-scrip. As you are
probably aware, Albertsons dropped their
"Preferred Savings" cards on June 20. Since the

Community Partner program was tied to the
Preferred Card, they had to change how it is
administered. We have just received the new
cards this week and will be distributing them
right away. They are good immediately. We
will receive a donation from Albertsons equal to
8 weeks' worth of our total earned over the last
year to make up for the time between June 20
and the use of the new cards.

The E-scrip system is just as easy. Register
your Master Card and/or Visa Card at
www.escrip.com. We get a percent of your
purchases made with registered cards at
participating merchants credited to our checking
account. Stores in the area that are in the
program include Pep Boys, and several
restaurants including Bangkok Pepper, Jando's
Italian Cuisine, Panache, Ye-Ye Kitchen, La
Cuesta, Michelino's, Downtown Sports Bar,
Medallions Restaurant, Cincinnati Club, Bar 26,
Cappettos Pizzeria, Café Central, and Hudson's
Grill. Macy's is also in the system but you need
to have a Macy's card to register and use. Go to

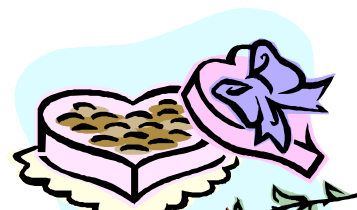
